Letterkenny mourns passing of Cllr Tadgh Culbert (57)

FAMILY, friends and political colleagues will unite tomorrow (Saturday) at 11am for the funeral of town councillor Tadhg Culbert (57) who died on Wednesday.

Cllr Culbert's passing shortly before lunchtime at The Donegal Hospice has robbed the town of an enthusiastic political representative who has been described as a 'true adopted son' of Letterkenny.

Dubbed the 'Comeback Kid' after he won back a seat on the town council in 2009- ten years after he had lost it- Cllr Culbert's death has evoked widespread sympathy.

Many people have spoke of his unstinting work ethic, good humour and his passion for sport with St Eunan's GAA club and Letterkenny Rovers.

The Limerick Junction native was well known throughout the area through his work as a clerk at Letterkenny Post Office. He first came to the town as a trainee in 1973 and remained here ever since. He joined St Eunan's and Burt as a hurler in the early 70's and lined out in goals for Donegal.

Such was his popularity he was first elected to Letterkenny Town Council in 1985 and served as chairman on two occasions.

He lost his seat in 1999, but was reelected a decade later in 2009, and the following year, he took the title of Mayor for the first time.

FORCE

In 2011, he was the driving force behind the organisation of the Letterkenny 400 celebrations reflecting his passion for arts and heritage.

He was a keen sportsman and had great passion for his beloved Tipperary hurling team. He was a former Vice-Chairman of Letterkenny Rovers and was heavily involved in St Eunan's GAA club.

Clir Culbert, was a former member of Independent Fianna Fáil but later joined Fianna Fáil.

Cllr Culbert is also survived by his son, Andrew and daughter Lisa, brothers, Tom, Padraig, Philip, Jarlath and a sister, Siobhan, his father and mother in law-Charlie and Margaret Flood, brothers-in law- Gabriel and Cathal as well as a wide circle of family and friends.

Cllr Culbert will be laid to rest in New Leck Cemetery after Requiem Mass in St Eunan's Cathedral.
